Swimming

Class 2 will be going swimming during the whole of the Spring Term every Monday morning 10:30-12 (starting on January 14th). This will be one of their PE lessons every week and is part of the National Curriculum which we have to deliver. Last year we trialled all of the children going and, whilst that had its merits, financially it is not something we can continue to do due to the amount of parents not paying. However, by providing these swimming sessions for Class 2, we are still meeting our statutory expectations of the children achieving their 25m target by the end of Year 6. As there are some Y6 children who have not yet achieved this objective, they will attend the Class 2 sessions as well, but only until they have achieved the 25m mark. Full details to follow in January. There is a charge of £3 towards the cost of the coach.

As we move into the Spring Term, we have some new clubs available as well as some of the original ones! Lego club is one of the new additions and because this club is organised and resourced by an outside company, it is chargeable.
