This comes to thank you for your co-operation and goodwill, which has done so much to assist Andrew Raistrick and his Senior Leadership Team in providing a safe and happy learning environment in school since March, when the challenges presented by Covid 19 took hold.

Despite being unable to visit our schools in the usual way, governors have continued to meet virtually and our weekly telephone contact with the Executive Head or his senior members of staff assures us that your support has been greatly appreciated.

As well as managing the fall-out from school closure, our schools have complied with all of the recommendations from the DfE. The children were assessed in September to ascertain the shortfall between home learning and class teaching when schools were closed.
