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# Dear Parents/Carers

### **Welcome Back**

The start of a new school year is always such an exciting time and with it brings a chance for a fresh start and a fresh challenge. Once again, the children have already impressed us so much with their eagerness to get back into the school routine and it was an absolute pleasure to see them coming in today with smiles on their faces. I appreciate that not all children may have been keen to get out of bed and get ready for school today, but well done to all of you for getting them to school on time and looking so smart. Now it's time to keep the year going as well as it has started!

## **Keeping Everyone Safe in School**

Whilst I don't want to create additional anxiety about Covid-19, it is important that I share with you what our current plans are to keep everyone in school as safe and well as possible.

- Children will no longer be in bubbles but classes will still spend break and lunch times separate. We found this to be better, so we have kept it!
- Likewise, we are continuing with children coming to school in their PE kit when it is their PE day. We will review this termly.
- As it is good hygiene practice, we will be regularly discussing and enforcing the 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' message around our school.
- We will also continue with regular handwashing throughout the day.
- We will keep the corridors and classrooms ventilated whilst ensuring the environment is comfortable for both staff and children.
- We are continuing with having two different entry points in the morning and also expecting parents to keep children with them on the playground. This has helped all children come in to school calmly and ready to learn, so we would appreciate your continued support!
- We will continue to immediately isolate and send home children with symptoms of Covid-19 so that they can take a PCR test. We would ask that parents have this administered within 24 hours and inform of us of the result as soon as possible. We no longer need to send other children home because of positive cases, but we do have to report each one to Lincolnshire Health.

All of the above measures are based on the current guidance from the DfE and local government, taking our school, staff and children into account. If you have any concerns or questions, do not hesitate to make an appointment to speak with myself.
