CONGRATULATIONS Surfleet Primary School Hockey Team




Surfleet Primary School Hockey Team took part in the Hockey Tournament on Friday 5th May at Glen Park in Surfleet.


School Child Protection & Safeguarding Policy Sept 2022



Reporting the Absence of your child

We have a new email address set up to allow parents to notify us of the absence of their child and any medical/dental appointments arranged.

Please use attendance@su.keystonemat.org

If a child is absent, parents must contact the school as soon as possible on the first day of absence **by telephone** and communicate in writing (e-mail to attendance@su,keystonemat.org or by letter) on the first day they return with an explanation of the absence – parents must do this even if they have already telephoned the school. Alternatively, parents can call into school and report to reception in person.





Medical & Dental Appointments

We do ask to attempt to make all medical and dental appointments during school holidays or after school hours where possible.

Medical/Dental appointments during school hours will not be authorised unless an appointment card, hospital letter or text from the GP/hospital/dentist is forwarded to school.

Providing these retrospectively is acceptable. Absence will only be authorised for the duration of the appointment plus any reasonable travel time.

Free School Meals

Parents did you know you may be able to claim for Free School Meals if you receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Children who receive any of the qualifying benefits listed above in their own right are also eligible to receive free school meals and they can also access free holiday clubs during the:

- Easter holidays
- summer holidays
- Christmas holidays

Clubs provide a wide range of activities, for example:

- sports and games
- arts and crafts
- music
- drama
- learning about food as well as healthy meals and snacks


Parent Workshop - Thurs 18th May 2023

We are very excited to let you know that the schools across the Keystone Academy Trust have organised some online parent workshops to support you. We recognise that if your child has special educational needs or is experiencing some difficulties, that it can be difficult to find and access help. We have looked at the topics that parents tell us are difficult to manage at home and have asked an Educational Psychologist to provide two workshops for us over the summer term. These workshops will be delivered online via Teams so that they are more accessible for you. You can either join in the session live, or access the recording at a time convenient to you and your family.

The first session is to support 'Managing challenging behaviour after school' and will run on Thursday 18^{th} May 9.30-10.30. The second session is to support 'Managing sensory needs at home' and will run on Thursday 22^{nd} June 9.30-10.30. There will be the opportunity to ask questions, however if you wish to access the session more privately, cameras can be turned off.

We do hope that these sessions will be helpful to you, and that you are able to attend.
