

Reporting the Absence of your child

We have a new email address set up to allow parents to notify us of the absence of their child and any medical/dental appointments arranged.

If a child is absent, parents must contact the school as soon as possible on the first day of absence **by telephone** and communicate in writing (e-mail to <u>attendance@su.keystonemat.org</u> or by letter) on the first day they return with an explanation of the absence – parents must do this even if they have already telephoned the school. Alternatively, parents can call into school and report to reception in person.

Medical & Dental Appointments



We do ask to attempt to make all medical and dental appointments during school holidays or after school hours where possible.

Medical/Dental/Opticians appointments during school hours will not be authorised unless an appointment card, hospital letter or text from the GP/hospital/dentist/Opticians is forwarded to school.

Providing these retrospectively is acceptable. Absence will only be authorised for the duration of the appointment plus any reasonable travel time.

Free School Meals

Parents did you know you may be able to claim for Free School Meals if you receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Children who receive any of the qualifying benefits listed above in their own right are also eligible to receive free school meals and they can also access free holiday clubs during the:

- Easter holidays
- summer holidays
- Christmas holidays

Clubs provide a wide range of activities, for example:

- sports and games
- arts and crafts
- music
- drama
- learning about food as well as healthy meals and snacks

- School Logo or Plain Sky-Blue T-Shirt
- Trainers for outside use, Plimsoles for Indoor Use

Applying for Primary School Placement - Sept 2024

If you have a younger sibling at home, I know it seems early to think about your child's school placement for September 2024, but it's just around the corner and the applications are due to open very soon.

Please see below some information to help you.

Application process

You should apply for a primary or infant school place if your child:

• is born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020

When to apply for a primary school place

The dates when you can apply for a primary school place are:

- 15 November 2023 and closes on 15 January 2024
- then re-opens 17 April 2024 and closes on 17 May 2024

However, we will accept applications until 12 noon on 9 February 2024. After that deadline, we cannot process any new or change any existing applications. If an application is received after this time, it will be processed after national offer day.

Other local authorities may not operate an extended deadline. If you apply to schools outside Lincolnshire, that local authority decides whether to accept a late application.

How to apply

You must apply through your home local authority. You can list any school in any local authority on the application.

You can apply online at <u>https://www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/parentportal</u>, by phone, or by requesting a paper form (telephone 01522 782030). Apply using one method only.

You will receive an email if you apply online and enter a valid email address. This email will confirm your preferences and state that your application is being considered.

If you apply by phone and provide a valid email address, you will receive confirmation of your application by email.

If you cannot provide a valid email address, we will send you a confirmation letter by post. You must then verify the details and return it to us.

Applying for Secondary School Placement - Sept 2024

If your child is in year 6 at primary school you may already be aware and thinking of their choice of secondary school and perhaps your child is taking/taken their 11+ and you're wondering when the applications are open.

Well please see below some information to help you with that.

Application process

You should apply for a secondary school place when your child is in Year 6.

When to apply for a secondary school place

The dates when you can apply for a secondary school place are

- 8 September 2023 and close on 31 October 2023
- then re-opens 1 March 2024 and closes 25 March 2024

However, we accept applications until 12 noon on 14 December 2023. After that deadline we cannot process any new applications or changes of applications. If an application is received after this time, it will be processed after national offer day.

Other local authorities may not operate an extended deadline. If you are applying to schools outside Lincolnshire, that local authority decides whether to accept a late application.

Grammar school tests take place in September. The results are posted before 31 October

How to apply

You must apply through your home local authority. You can list any school in any local authority on the application.

You can apply online at https://www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/parentportal, by phone, or by requesting a paper form (telephone 01522 782030). Apply using one method only.

You will receive an email if you apply online and enter a valid email address. This email will confirm your preferences and state that your application is being considered.

If you apply by phone and provide a valid email address, you will receive confirmation of your application by email.

If you cannot provide a valid email address, we will send you a confirmation letter by post. You must then verify the details and return it to us.

Grammar & High Schools

These are secondary schools that require children to pass a test to be admitted.

You should contact the grammar school or visit the Lincolnshire grammar schools' website at <u>http://www.grammarschools.lincs.sch.uk/</u> to find out about the 11+ testing arrangements. When you child takes the 11+ tests, you must let the school know if they:

- have any special educational needs
- speak English as a second language
- are feeling unwell

If your child reaches the required standard in the 11+, they will not automatically be offered a place. You must still name the grammar school on your application. Your application will be considered alongside other applicants in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria.
